Student Support at Crookwell High School

Earlier this year, we were very fortunate to pick up the permanent position of Student Support Officer, very ably filled by Mr James Crocker. Mr Crocker has done a wonderful job in supporting students individually, as well as in group settings. I am please to announce that as of next year, our School Counselling service time will increase from the current two days per week, to five days per week. This increase to having two positions at Crookwell High School full-time supporting student wellbeing will greatly supplement the efforts of staff in other wellbeing roles and have an increased positive impact on our students. I will provide more specific details of staffing in the new year.

Industrial Action Arrangements

As I have previously emailed to families, there is a state-wide teacher's strike taking place on Tuesday 7th December. The majority of staff will not be at school on the 7th, and so the school will be providing minimal supervision of students on the day of the strike. Maths News




Thank you to all students who have already returned their textbooks. Students are reminded to return their Mathematics textbooks to their Mathematics teacher this week if they haven't already done so.


2022 Year 12 students are a term into their HSC studies for Mathematics. Mathematics Advanced and Numeracy students have their first assessment task due this week. Mathematics Standard students have their first task and will be required to submit early Term 1 next year.

This year we have trialled the use of homework books with Year 7 & 8 students. These books are for students to consolidate the learning they are completing in class. Due to the success of these books, we will be providing all Year 7 & 8 students with one, free of charge, in 2022. Australian Business Week

November 22nd -26th our Year 10 students immersed themselves in Australian Business Week (ABW). This involved forming four small companies to run cafe chains. Each student played a particular role within their company and they worked together to make decisions about such things as company branding, advertising, promotions, ordering of stock, setting product prices, determining staffing levels and managing cafe maintenance. These decisions were entered into a computer simulation and the results determined their next set of decisions. The students ran their businesses over a simulated two-year period. During this time they also launched advertising campaigns by utilising social media platforms, posters, business cards and by creating video commercials. Each company prepared a written report and delivered a verbal presentation to communicate details about their performance over the simulated two-year period. A trade display was held on Friday to allow the school community to taste the unique flavour of each cafe chain. Throughout the week students had the opportunity to learn tips and tricks for running a successful cafe business from some of our local operators. A huge vote of thanks to Billie Willis from Ensemble and Co in Crookwell, Melinda Medway from The Old Coach Stables in Gunning and Chloe Smith from Grand Ettie in Taralga for so generously sharing their time and expertise with our students. The students were also wonderfully supported by Fiona Robertson and Kelly Garske who spent all day on Friday serving as judges to determine winners in each category: video advertisement, trade display, written report and verbal report. Each company was also judged on their ability to work as a team and how well they performed in the computer simulation. Thanks also to Crookwell IGA for donating funds to assist with the running of ABW.
