## Principal's Bulletin 27th November 2023 Year 10 Program

They began with the Work Experience program spending a week with employers in Crookwell, surrounding areas and even further afield. This program has allowed students to focus their attention on careers that may (or may not) be in their sights when undertaking senior studies and further education. The students returned to undertake a Senior First Aid course over two days with trainers from the Royal Surf Lifesaving Association. Later this week, students will complete 'All My Own Work', a mandatory course for the HSC which highlights the rules and expectations around plagiarism and referencing sources of information. #### **HSC Major Art Works**

Congratulations to our Year 12 Art class who have submitted their major art work for the HSC.

- 1. Tom's body of work, "Faded" is a photographic reflection on men's mental health. Mirrors were used as a central theme to show how you reflect on yourself and your identity.
- 2. Leah's body of work is based on the concept of a change of perspective. The use of neon paints and other styles have been used to represent natural objects to present the concept of change of prospective idea.
- 3. Hannah's artwork explores how wearing different types of masks are used everyday to cover a range of emotions and keep us from being our true identity.
- 4. Isabel's body of work explores the portrayal of losing oneself and the darkness of warped perception. Contrasting styles of painting were used to present the concept of loss of control and despair while also creating a flow between each painting.
- 5. Rueben's body of work "interconnection" represents the interconnection between different areas of Australia joined by one aspect of nature, the Murray River. This river intertwines through three states in different forms from Kosciusko to the Coorong.
















### **Peer Support Leadership Training**
