NSW School Vaccination Program 2024 (Catch Ups)

Each year NSW Ministry of Health (MoH) conducts a free vaccination program (SVP) to students throughout NSW. Teams of authorised nurse immunisers are employed to officer vaccination to all eligible students according to National Health and Medical Research Council (NH&MRC) and MoH guidelines. The specialised team of nurses will visit Crookwell High School on **Wednesday 23rd October for catch up sessions** for those who have missed out. Paper copies of the consent form are available at the office. It is important that your child eats breakfast, has a drink before school and remains calm on immunisation clinic days.


