School Behaviour Management and Support Plan

Last week we published our School Behaviour Management and Support Plan on our school website. This plan highlights key aspects of our processes, procedures, responsibilities and expectations around managing and supporting student behaviour. Some aspects of the plan reflect already embedded practices, and some parts are new and will be phased in with staff training and student familiarisation. This includes 'Restorative Practice' and 'Ready to Learn'. As new practices are put in place, the plan will be modified to reflect these changes. As such, the plan should be looked at as a living document. We will keep our community updated when any significant changes are made and uploaded.

Ready to Learn

Ready to Learn is a set of expectations for every student in every classroom, ensuring they are Ready to Learn every day at school. Many of the expectations have been part of teacher's repertoires over many years – this program aims to bring consistency across all classes, especially in years 7-10. Whilst senior students will have slight variations to the procedures, the Ready to Learn ethos are the same. Students all have copies of the expectations, and they will be taught explicitly and positively throughout the year. One area in which families can help us is ensuring students have all required equipment for learning – pens, pencils, calculators etc. Staff will all have equipment to loan for the lesson, but the expectation is that this is the exception, and students are prepared each lesson. Please do not hesitate to contact the school if there are any financial hardships in providing this equipment. The Ready to Learn expectations are included in this newsletter

READY TO LEARN



All learning equipment for classes

- Check your timetable and organise your learning equipment for all classes
- If any equipment is missing, please see the front office/ SSO / DP / teacher for support
- . At the end of each break take your learning equipment for the next 1 or 2 lessons

Being on time

- · Enter class quietly and place chewing gum into the garbage bin
- Follow seating plan
- · Stand behind your chair quietly
- · Once given permission to sit please ensure learning equipment is ready and, on the desk, neatly.



Responding to roll appropriately.

- Respond to the roll
- · Work independently on a settler activity while Roll is being marked
- · "Yes Miss" or "Yes Sir" for example


We were lucky enough to get a second place in the School Steer class and Henry placed in the parading
