
School Development Day focus

STEM Windfarm Visit

On Monday 5th May, our Year 8 students had the opportunity to visit the Gullen Range Solar and Windfarm. Upon our arrival, the students underwent a safety induction before being guided around the complex. First stop was to the solar farm where the students saw the meteorological station and the vast array of solar panels. They then returned to the main complex where the students saw the safety harness used by the workers on the turbines and saw some of the equipment and cables used for building and repairing the turbines. The last stop was to a wind turbine where the students had the opportunity to get up close to and investigate the inside of an actual tower. 














Sports News
